1. Getting Started

Welcome to Comic Connect, a web-based tool for cataloging your comic collection.

This software will help you create your own comic database with a minimum of manual data entry. Just search our “Core” online comic database, by comic series or by barcode, and all comic details will be provided automatically, including creators, characters, plot, cover art, preview art, etc...

Now let's you get you started.

Are you just starting out with Comic Connect?

Then lets start adding comics!

1. Click the **+ Add Comics** button in the toolbar. The Add Comics screen will appear.
2. On the Title tab, start typing the first few letters of series of the comic(s) that you want to add. Up to 5 suggestion will appear instantly.
3. Click the series you'd like to add issues from (or use the arrow keys on your keyboard and hit Enter).
4. Use the checkboxes to select the issues you want to add (you can checkbox multiple issues).
5. Now click the big blue **“Add to Collection”** button on the bottom right to add the comic(s) to your database.

Congrats! You have just added your first comic(s)!

Already have a list of your comics in a different program?

No problem at all, you can import that data straight into Comic Connect

1. Export your existing data to a CSV file. You will get the best results if your data contains barcodes!
2. Choose **“Import from Text File”** from the menu.
3. Choose the file you just exported.
4. Pick the format settings to match our CSV file.
5. Select the Fields to match the fields in your CSV file (**very important!**)
6. Click the blue **“Import Comics** button at the bottom.

Already using CLZ Comics or Comic Collector?

Excellent, then you probably already have comics entered in those mobile and/or desktop solutions. Of course, you won't have to re-enter those.

Just **Sync with CLZ Cloud** from your CLZ Comics mobile app or from the Comic Collector desktop software

and your data will be immediately available in Comic Connect.


After doing additions or changes using the Comic Connect software, just use Sync with CLZ Cloud again to download those change to the app or desktop program.

2. Adding comics

Adding comics to your database is quick and easy, no need to do a lot of manual entry. Just search our CLZ Core online comic database for your comic, either by series or by barcode, and you will get full comic details automatically, including creators, characters, plot, cover art, preview art, etc...

In Comic Connect, there are 3 ways to add comics:

- **[By Series](#)**: search Core by series title and select your issues from the results.
- **[By Barcode](#)**: search Core by entering or scanning barcodes.
- **[Manually](#)**: enter all comic details manually.



2.1. Adding comics by series title

This lets you search our Core online comic database by comic series, then select and add from the search results. The smart “Search-as-you-type” system will probably find your series before you finished typing it!

1. Click the **+ Add Comics** button in the toolbar.
2. In the Add Comics screen, select the Series tab at the top.
3. Enter the series name of the comic(s) you want to add.
4. Now either:
 - Select a series from the Search-As-You-Type suggestions.
(click it or use your arrow and enter keys).
 - Or, click Search and select your series from the search results. Expand the series into issues by clicking the dropdown arrow next to it.
5. Check the boxes to select which issues you wish to add.
6. Now click the big **“Add to Collection”** button on the bottom right.

That’s all you need to know to add comics. However, there’s more to this screen:

- Try the Find Cover button there to select a different cover image.
- Use the arrow in the “Add to Collection” button to switch it to “Add to Wish List”.



TIP: to get the most out of the **“Search-as-you-type”** system, start typing the most “discerning” word, e.g. to find *Avengers / X-Men: Bloodties*, do not start typing *avengers*, but type *bloodties* instead.

2.2. Adding comics by barcode

You can search and add comics to your collection by barcode with the Add Comics screen. Barcodes added to the queue will instantly show series title, issue number, issue extension, cover date, barcode and cover art.

You can either search 1 barcode to add to your collection/wish list, or search multiple barcodes and add them all in one go.

1. Click the **+ Add Comics** button in the toolbar. The Add Comics screen will appear.
2. In the Add Comics screen, select the Barcode tab at the top.
3. Enter or scan the barcode into the search box.
4. Click *Search* to add the barcode to the add queue and instantly find your comic.
5. Now click the big **“Add to Collection”** button on the bottom right.

You can type/scan multiple comic barcodes and search them. They will all be stored in the left hand panel for you to add in one go with the button bottom left.



Accidentally typed/scanned a wrong barcode or decided you don't want to add it? Click the **“Edit”** button at the top of the list of barcodes and use the red **“X”** button to remove the barcode from the list.

Scanning barcodes with your phone or tablet

You can use it to scan barcodes into the Add Comics screen directly using your phone or tablet, you can scan and enter barcodes with our free barcode scanning app [CLZ Scanner](#).

1. Click the CLZ Scanner icon in the far right of the barcode entry box and follow instructions to download the CLZ Scanner app **and** log in to the app.
2. Go back to the Add Comics screen and scan some barcodes.

2.2.1. Scanning barcodes with CLZ Scanner

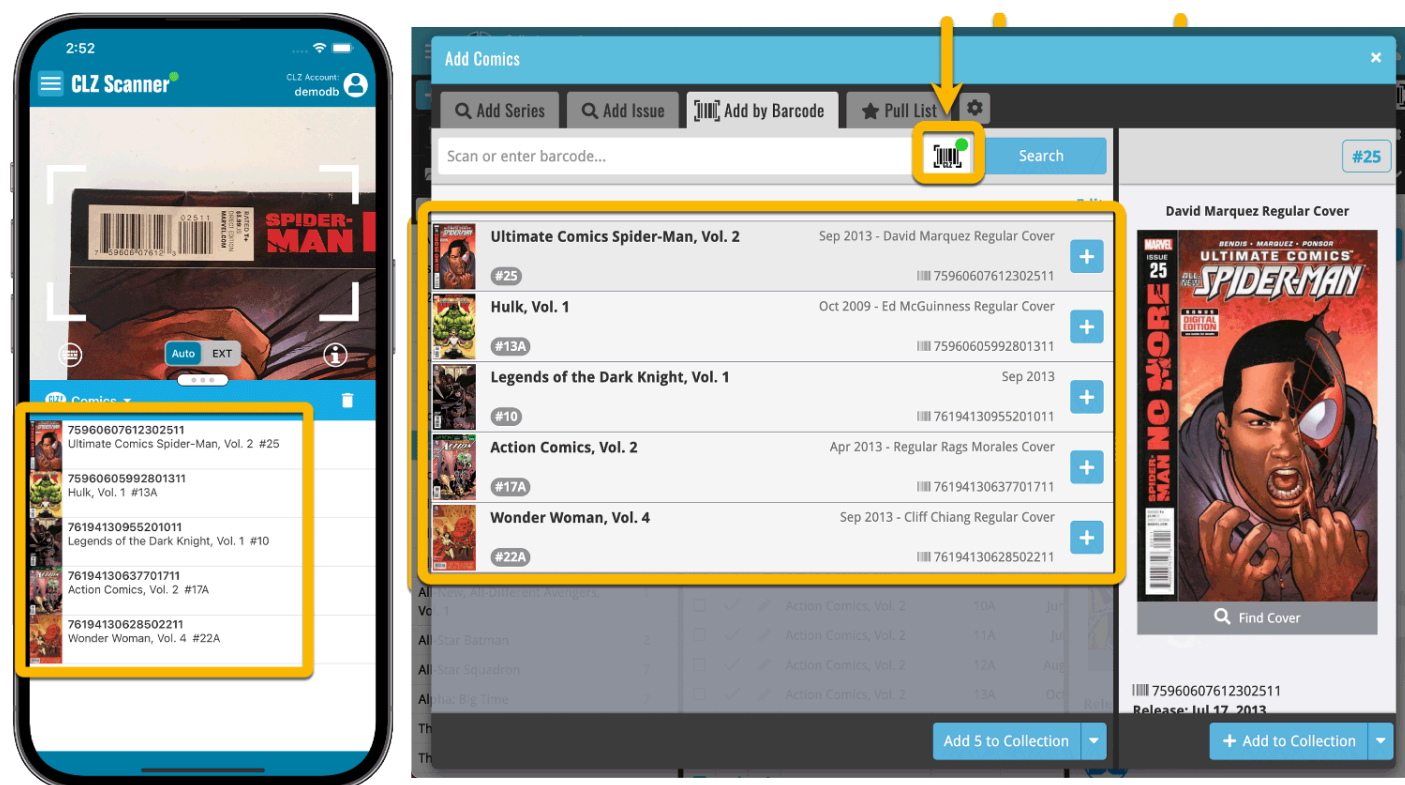
CLZ Scanner is a barcode scanner app. You can use it on your phone to scan barcodes and then instantly send those scanned barcodes to the Add Comics screen of the Comic Connect software. From there, you can then easily and comfortably add the scanned comics to your collection.

How to get started with the CLZ Scanner app:

Getting started with CLZ Scanner is super quick and easy. Here's how:

1. In Comic Connect, open the Add Comics screen and go to the Barcode tab.
2. Click the CLZ Scanner icon in the far right of the barcode entry box and follow instructions to download the CLZ Scanner app **and** log in to the app.

When set up, just scan barcodes with the app and they will automatically appear in the Barcode queue of Comic Connect's Add Comics screen!



Using CLZ Scanner

Next time you want to use CLZ Scanner, you don't have to go through those steps again. CLZ Scanner can sync to your barcode queue even while you do not have Comic Connect open:

1. Scan barcodes with CLZ Scanner app.
2. Open the Add Comics screen in Comic Connect and the barcodes will automatically show up in your

barcode queue!

You don't even have to be online with your phone while scanning. You can still scan to your app's queue while offline. The queue will then sync the first time you are online with the app again.

Or: you do have the Add Comics screen open while scanning and the scanned barcodes will instantly sync to your Barcode queue there. And when you add a comic, the barcode will be removed from your queue on both sides automatically.

2.3. Pull List

The Pull List tab shows you all issues of your pull list series that either have been released in the last month or are going to be released in the upcoming months. Very useful to keep track of issues you may want to add to your wish list!



2.4. Adding comics manually

If we do not have the comic you're looking for, you can choose to add your comic manually. You will be offered to add a comic manually if you don't get any results, or scroll to the bottom of the results.

If you wish to skip searching you can directly add a comic manually by clicking "*Add Manually*" top right of the Add Comics screen.

1. Click the **+ Add Comics** button in the toolbar. The Add Comics screen will appear.
2. Click **Add Manually** top right.
3. Enter comic details and click "**OK**" to add it.

3.1. Editing a comic entry

All editing takes place in the “Edit Comic” screen, which you can open with the Edit button:



In this screen, you can find all the comic’s properties, on multiple tab pages. Many of the comic details will already be filled in, provided by our online database. You can modify it all, to change or to complete the information.

However, the main reason to edit your comic entries, is to add information that is specific to you, e.g. when and where you purchased the comic, who in your household owns it, your personal notes or ratings, etc...

Example of adding a “Location” to one of your comics

1. Edit the comic in your collection.
2. Click on the “**Personal**” tab.
3. Top left of this tab you should spot the “**Location**” field for you to enter the location in.
4. Click “**OK**” to save.

After editing some fields, click the **OK** button to save the changes. If you’re unhappy with the changes, click **Cancel**.



You can clear a value for all comics in your selection by using Edit on multiple comics, then checking the box and leaving the field empty.

3.3. Removing comic entries

You can remove a comic from your collection from the details page, or select multiple in one go and remove them.

Removing 1 comic

1. Click on the comic you wish to remove.
2. Click the “**Remove**” button at the top.
3. Confirm by clicking the red “**Remove**” button.

Removing multiple comics in one go

Select the comics you want to remove. To select comics, click the checkboxes on the left of each comic entry in the list. Checkboxes are also available in Card View and Images View, just hover your mouse over a comic.

3.4. Managing pick lists

With every comic you add to your collection, Comic Connect stores common information in pick lists. Examples of pick lists include Genre, Format, Location, Owner, etc.

With the Manage Pick List screen you can modify all pick list items. With it you can add, edit, remove and merge pick list items.

How to edit, merge or remove pick list items:

Start by opening “**Manage Pick Lists**” from the menu top left. Now use the **dropdown menu** to choose which pick list you want to work on.

- To **edit** one of the pick list entries, just click on it.
- To **merge** entries, select them with the checkboxes, then click the merge button: 
- To **remove** a pick list item, use the X button.

✿ You can use the **search box** to quickly find a pick list item in the chosen list.

! **Warning:** any change you make to an existing pick list item will **affect all comics** that also use that pick list item.

To **add** a new pick list item, use the Edit Comic screen and enter something new for one of the fields.

When do I use the Manage Pick Lists screen?

Below are some example situations to help you understand when you can use this screen to fix issues with certain pick list fields.

Quickly fix bad spelled list items for multiple comics in 1 go:

Example: You may have added a “Country” to a comic and also already added that country to many other comics and only find out now that it wasn’t spelled correctly. This may mean you already have tens and tens of comics with the bad spelled country.

The Manage Pick Lists screen can help you sort that out: Use it to find the country in the country list, and edit the entry. Fix the spelling mistake, and when you’re done all comics with that country will now have the new and correct spelling.

Use it to merge duplicate list items or a merge strange spelled formats in your list items:

It can happen that duplicate list items appear in Connect. It could be that we spell a format differently than you have in the past.

Example: If you notice you have a duplicate format (for instance the format: “Blu-ray” and “Blu-ray Disc”), you can merge them using the Manage Pick List screen in the app to 1 single format. Doing this will instantly update all comics that used one of those 2 formats to now show the new one.



Any pick list item that you change will affect all comics that use that value. For instance: you can change the spelling of an “owner” name in Manage Pick Lists, which then instantly modifies all comics in your database that have that same owner name.

3.5. Linking comics to Core

Comic Connect is built around our central online database: **Core for Comics**. All factual comic details and cover images are used and shown directly from *Core for Comics*.

This factual comic data is not stored per user. Instead, it is stored only once, inside Core for Comics then linked to for every CLZ Cloud user that owns that comic.

So in order to see full comic details and cover images in CLZ Cloud, it is essential that your comic entries are linked to the corresponding entries in Core for Comics.

Without linking, your comic entries will show up as simple Title entries, with just the personal data you may have filled in.

✿ If you use the “Add Comics” popup to add your comics to your collection, your comics will be linked already!

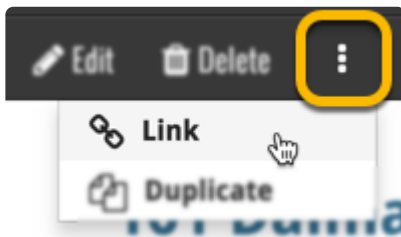
How to link your comics

If you have been using the Add Comics screen to catalog your comics, then most, if not all of your comics will already be linked.

Comics that you’ve added manually can be linked to entries in the central database.

You can also link comics to a specific edition to get specific edition information if you want.

- Click on the comic you want to link.
- Click the “**More**” icon and click “**Link**”



- The “**Link Comic**” page opens.
- Search for the comic and pick the correct result.
- Click the blue “**Link this Comic**” button to finish.

✿ Expand a result to see editions if you wish to link to a specific edition of a comic.

The advantages of linking and central shared data in Core for Comics

Automatic Updates: When our content managers or other users update the comic information in *Core for Comics* (e.g. to add a better cover image, to improve data, or to fix a typo), you will immediately see those changes in your collection, so your collection always automatically shows the latest version of the data and cover art.

It's fast: Sharing the factual comic data means that its retrieval can be optimized (e.g. by caching), resulting in a smooth experience when browsing your collection.

It's efficient: Shared factual comic data is only stored once, which means our servers are not clogged by duplicate copies of data and images (that are all the same for every user). This also makes it possible for our systems to make daily backups of your comic collection data.

What if a comic is not in Core for Comics?

If you can't find your comic when you try to link it, you can use the Report button at the bottom of the search results to report the missing comic to us.

3.6. Clearing your database

Need to start over? You can remove all comics from your database.

Remove all comics

1. Click the menu icon top left.
2. Click “**Clear Database**”.
3. Confirm by clicking “**Yes**”.

3.7. Managing Loans

Do you loan out comics to friends and family? If so, you can use Comic Connect to keep track of those loans!

Loaning a comic

To loan a comic, find and click it in your list, then click the “Loan” button at the top of the page.

Loaning multiple comics in one go

If you’d like to loan a couple of comics to one person in one go, you need to **select the comics you want to loan out** first. To select comics, click the checkboxes on the left of each comic entry in the list. Checkboxes are also available in Card View and Images View, just hover your mouse over a comic.

The Select Mode is automatically activated as soon as you checkbox the first comic, clearly indicated by the blue Batch Action Bar that replace the regular toolbar.

Now click the menu button (3 vertical dots) on the blue Batch Action Bar and select “**Loan**”. Fill in a person to loan the item to, and the Due Date too. Click “**Loan Comics**” to finish.

Keeping track of your loans

Click the menu top left, and then “**Loan Manager**” where you can see all your loaned out items, and directly return them. Alternatively you can also use CLZ Barry to scan a barcode of a comic, find it in your outstanding loans, and return it.

In the Loan Manager, you can click on a loaned item to modify the loan date, due date, return date, loaner and notes about the loan.

Print current loans to PDF

You can print out all your current loans to a PDF file by clicking the Print to PDF button in the Loan Manager screen. Alternatively, you can select a single loaner from the dropdown menu there, and only print out his/her current loans to a PDF file!

3.8. Multiple collections

Comic Connect allows you to have multiple sub-collections within one account. The collections will appear as little tabs at the bottom (e.g. like in Excel), so that you can easily switch between them.

Create and manage collections

You can create a new collection, rename existing collections, remove a collection or change their order (drag and drop) in the Manage Collections screen.

You can find the “**Manage Collections**” screen via the menu top left.

Moving comic(s) to other collections

You can freely move one or multiple comics between collections in your database file.

1. **Select the comic(s) you wish to move** by clicking checkboxes on the left of each comic entry in the list.
2. In the blue selection bar at the top, click on the “more icon” (3 vertical dots) and select **Move to other collection**.
3. Select the collection you wish to move it/them in.

3.9. Find duplicate comics

You can use this tool to find out if you've accidentally added multiple versions of the same comic, but perhaps with a different barcode or something else.

Find and remove duplicate comics

1. Click the menu icon top left and click **"Find Duplicates"**.
2. Select which field to find duplicates on using the dropdown menu
3. Click **"Find Duplicates"** to find your duplicates.
4. Now use the blue **"Keep"** button to keep a group of duplicates, or use the red **"Remove"** button to remove a duplicate!

If you click "Remove all duplicates automatically" the program will remove all duplicate entries and will only keep 1 single entry (the oldest one) in your database.



Use the **columns button**, top right, to set up the columns you'd like to see!

3.10. Re-assigning Index Numbers

How Index numbers work

{Comic Connect} automatically assigns and increments index numbers. The Index value is assigned when you add an comic to the database. The next comic you add to your collection will have an index number that is incremented by 1. Each Index number is only used once. When a number is deleted, the next added comic will still increment on the highest index number present in your collection.

Example:

- You have #s 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10
- You delete #4
- The next comic you add will automatically be #11. #4 will not return.
- If you manually change #11 to #4, the next comic you add will be #10, as #9 was the highest in your collection at that point.

Automatically Re-assign Index Numbers

If you automatically want to fill in any gaps that might've appeared over time, you can re-assign index numbers:

1. Open the menu top left and select "Re-Assign Index Values".
2. Now choose which fields you want to sort all items on, and it will assign index numbers based on that sorting.



Automatically re-assigned Index numbers can not be reverted.

4.1. List, cards, covers or shelves

Comic Connect comes in 4 different views that you can set. List, Cards, Covers and Shelves

To switch to a different view, click the view button on the toolbar:



Try it out!

List View

The list view shows all your comics in a neat list. You can [choose your own columns](#) in this view to select which data columns you want to see in your list.

Card View

The card view shows your comics in cards, with the most important identifying information about the comic. Hover your mouse over a comic to reveal an edit button to edit it directly.

Cover View

The cover view shows all the front covers of your comics. Hover your mouse over a comic to reveal an edit button to edit it directly. Use the slider to control the size of the images.

Shelves View

The shelves view shows all the front covers of your comics on shelves. Hover your mouse over a comic to reveal an edit button to edit it directly. Use the slider to control the size of the images on the shelves, and even pick from several different shelf styles!

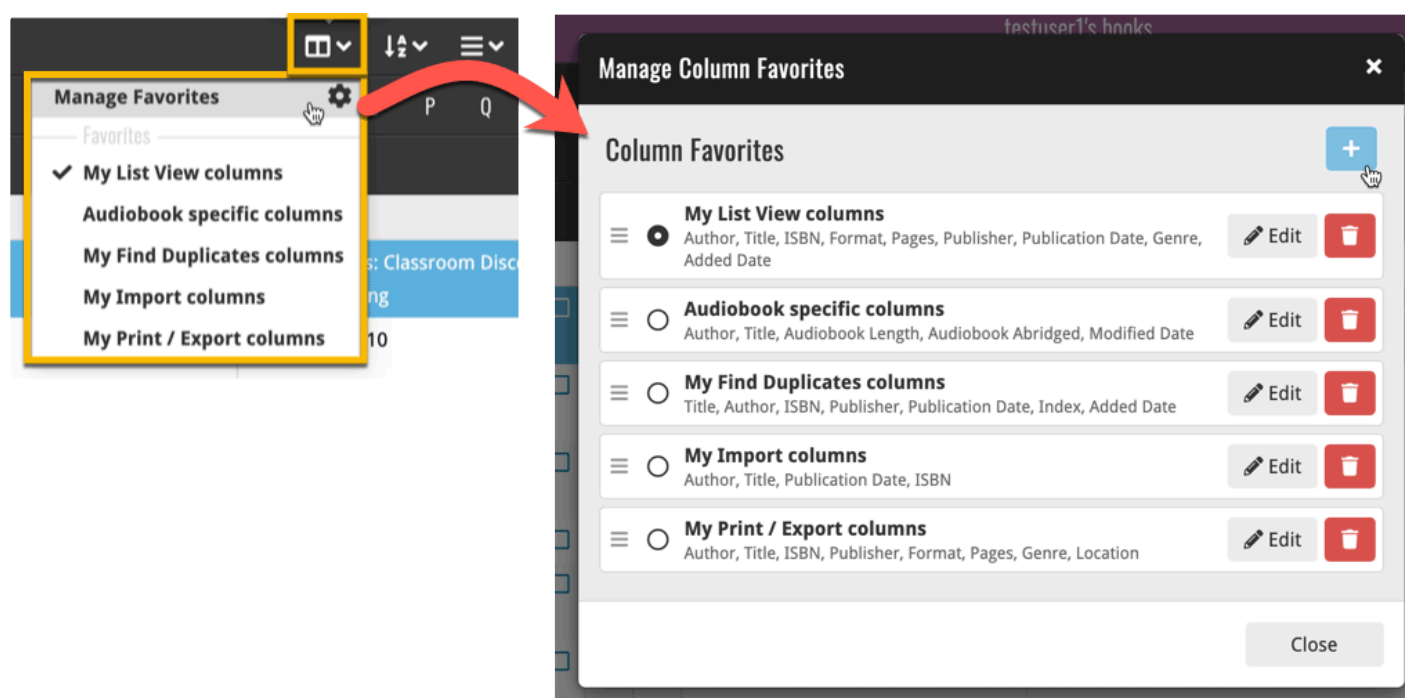
4.2. Choosing columns

While in list view (with rows of comics), you also see columns. You can choose which columns you wish to see, based on which information you find most important per comic. Maybe you want to make sure you always have your Location column in view: in that case, choose “Location” as one of your columns. You can also choose in which order the columns should show.

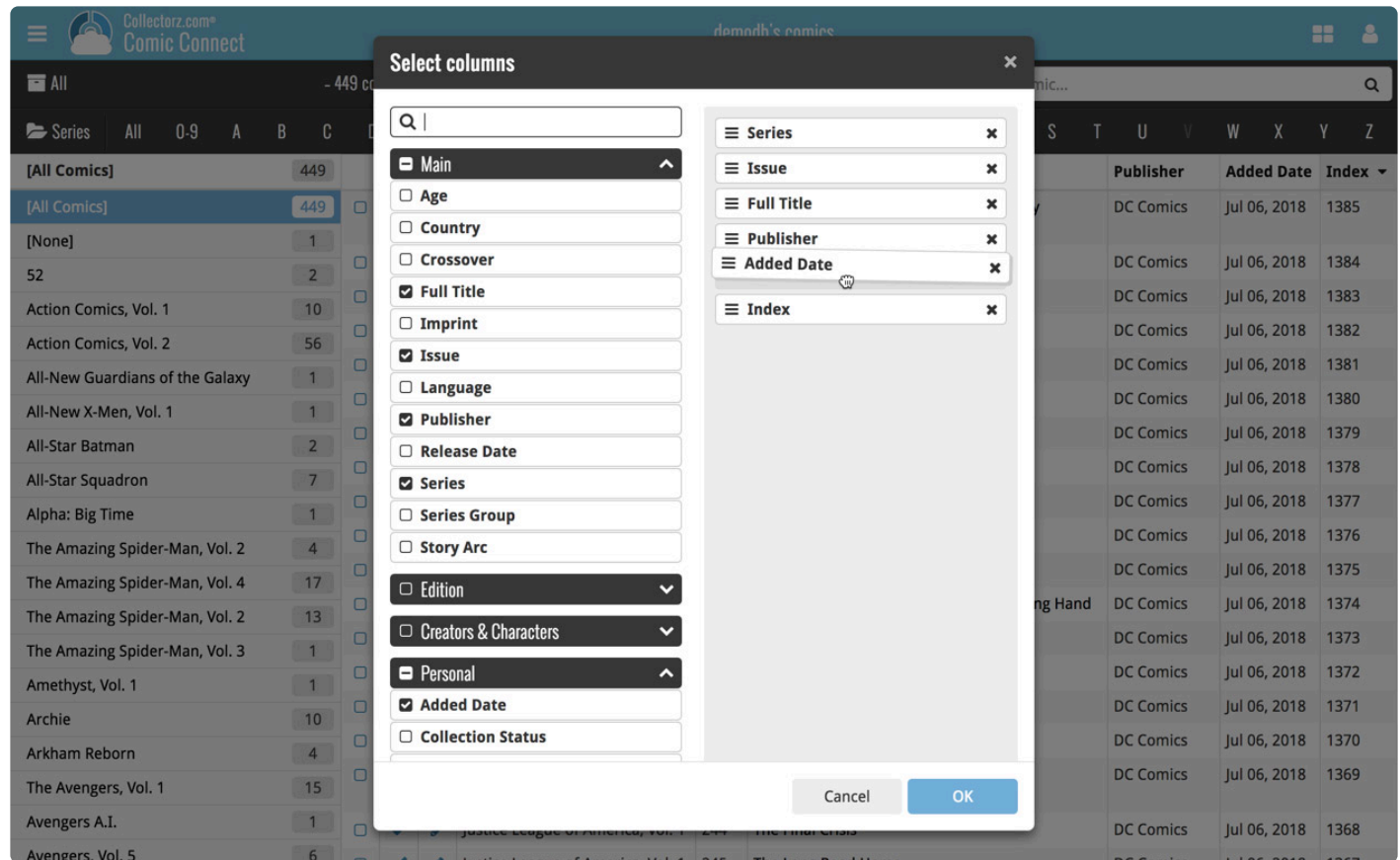
Choosing favorite columns with the column button

While in [list view](#), click the columns button on the toolbar: 

To create and manage your Favorites, choose Manage Favorites:



Select “Edit” to edit a favorite set, or click the “plus” button to add a new column set.



Find the fields you wish to add as columns, and use the checkboxes to select them. Drag them in the order you want them. Click “OK” to save your column selection.

4.3. Sorting your comic list


Sorting changes the order in which your comics are displayed. You can sort your comics in various ways. The most basic way to do this is by clicking a column header, but you can also use the sort button and pick a field to sort on.

Sorting by clicking a column header

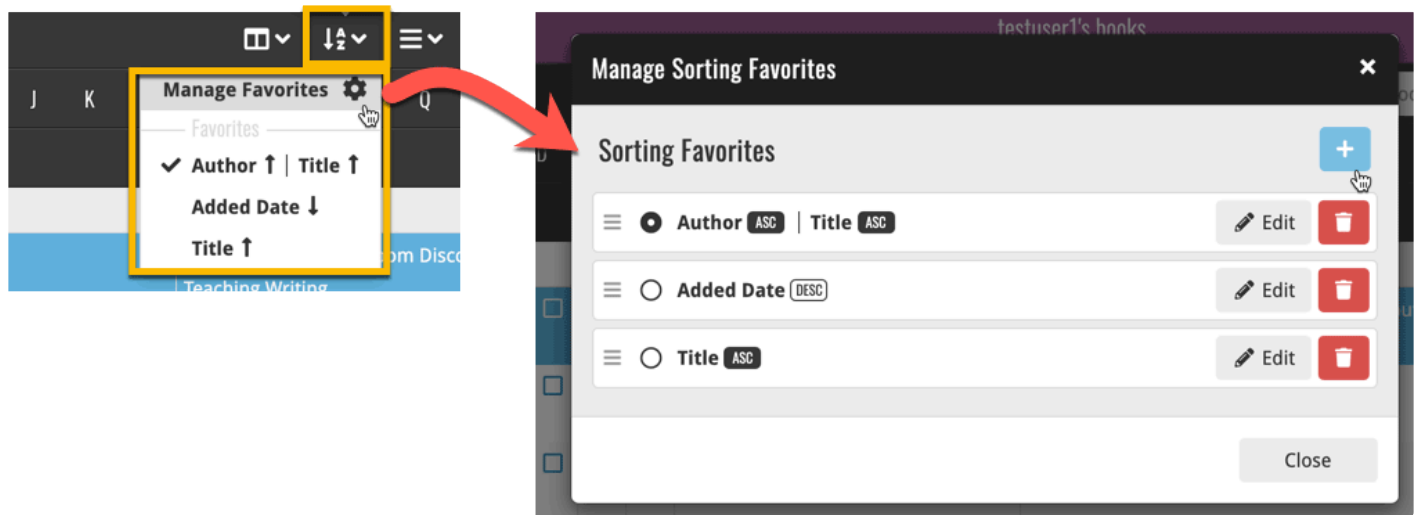
This is the easiest way to change the order of your comics. While in [list view](#), you can click a column header to immediately sort your comics on that field. Click it again to reverse the sort order.

For example, you can click the Series column header to sort your comics by Series:

Sorting using the sort button

Sorting using the sort button gives you some more power to sort your comics. To begin, click the sort button on the toolbar: 

To create and manage your Favorites, choose Manage Favorites:



Select “Edit” to edit a favorite set, or click the “plus” button to add a new sort set.

Find the field you wish to sort on on the left side (you can also use the search box at the top) and use the checkbox to select the field. Then choose if you wish to sort ascending (ASC) or descending (DESC). Click “OK” to save your sort order.

* Say you wish to sort your comics on Publisher first, and then on Series, you can checkbox a second field (or even more) in the “Select sort order” screen.

Want to group your items together in folders? Check out how to do that under “[Using folders](#)”.

4.4. Searching

If you're looking for a particular comic in your collection, your best bet is usually to use the search box. Typing a few letters in the search box will give you instant suggestions you can click – and quite often gets you to your comic fastest, but you can also hit enter on your keyboard to perform a full search on your collection.

Quick Search on your own collection

The quickest way to find the comic you're looking for is to use **Quick Search** top right.

You can just type a few letters and select the comic you're looking for. We're calling this "*Search-as-you-type*" and you may recognise it from your Add Comics screen.

Extensive search on your own collection

If you wish to perform a deeper search on more fields you can do an extensive search by hitting enter after typing (or click "View all results"). This option searches more fields in your collection and then shows you all found matches.

The extensive search searches the following fields:

- Series
- Issue No.
- Barcode
- Title
- Crossover
- Story Arc
- Plot
- Age
- Series Group
- Tags
- Notes

Searching folders

The folder panel is a powerful way to browse and filter your collection. Just group by Series, or Publisher, etc... click a folder and the list will give you all comics for the selected Series or Publisher.

To quickly find a specific folder use the search box right above the folder panel, that lets you instantly search/filter the folder panel as you type! Just typing a few letters is often enough to bring the folder you are looking for into view.

4.5. Alphabet bar

At the top of your screen you will find the alphabet bar with 28 buttons, “All”, “0-9” for numbers and then “A” to “Z”.

You can use the alphabet bar to quickly filter your comics by their first letter.

Clicking a letter button immediately filters down your list to show only the comics starting with that letter. So for instance, click the “A” to see all comics beginning with the letter A.

On mobile devices or smaller screens, the alphabet bar can be found under the AZ button at the top.

4.6. Using folders

You can group your comics into folders. You have a couple of presets to choose from, and your comics will automatically be grouped for you based on the information stored inside them.

For example: If you folder group on “Seriesgroup”, and you have a comic with “Batman” filled in as its Seriesgroup, then that comic will appear in the “Batman” folder.

To try this out yourself, click the **folder icon** top left and pick a field you wish to group your comics on. Now click on a folder to see the comics that are inside.

You’ll also notice you have an “[All Comics]” folder at the top. Click it to see all your comics.

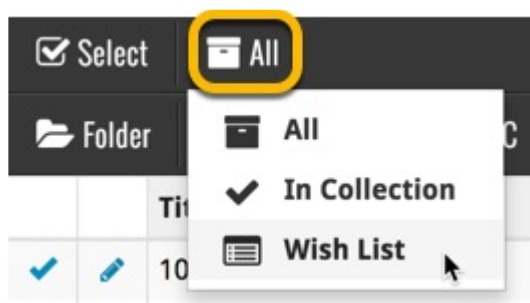
4.7. Collection vs Wish List

Comic Connect can be a great help in keeping track of the comics you own or plan to buy. Using the “Collection Status” field for each of your comics you can track if a comic is in your collection, or on your wish list.

Viewing Collection or Wish List items

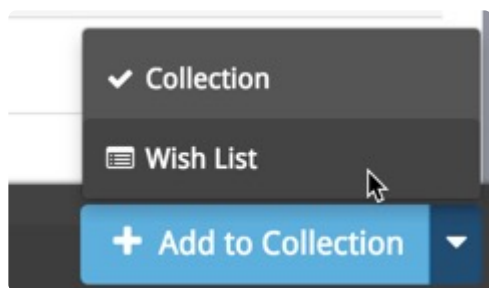
You can filter your comics based on what their collection status is. So you can pick to see all your comics, just the ones that are in collection, or just the ones that are on your wish list.

To do this, use the dropdown on your toolbar and pick your collection status filter:



Adding comics to your Collection or Wish List

While adding comics to your collection you can indicate if you want to add the comic to your Collection or to your Wish List:



If you try to add a comic that is already on your wish list, Comic Connect will ask you if you want to “move” the comic to your “Collection”. This changes the collection status for your existing comic!

Editing comics to change the “Collection Status” field

To change the collection status of a comic you have to edit it: Click the edit pencil for a comic to open the Edit Comic screen. Change the Collection Status at the bottom of the Edit Comic screen.

4.8. Statistics

If you want to find out some statistics on yourcomics, we've got you covered.

1. Click the menu icon top left.
2. Click "*Statistics*".

Find out your most recent additions and much more there.

5.1. Sharing online

If you want, you can share your collection with friends so they can see which comics you have!

Your public CLZ Cloud link

To find out your public Cloud Share link, click the menu icon top left and select “**CLZ Cloud Sharing**”. Copy the link under “**Public Cloud Sharing**” and send it to your friends!

You will find the **Share** button on comic details pages too so you can share a comic details page directly with a friend.

Privacy

You can change your CLZ Cloud data visibility in the settings screen to hide your collection partially or completely from the outside world if you want.

To do this, click the menu icon top left and select “**CLZ Cloud Sharing**”.

Your CLZ Cloud Visibility options:

You will find 3 options under CLZ Cloud visibility, here's what they mean:

Private Cloud Sharing

When you set your Cloud data visibility to **Private**, you can still share it with a **secret URL**.

Under “Private Cloud Sharing”, use the Generate button to set up a secret URL to share your private cloud data with someone. If you generate a new URL, the previous one will be replaced. Press the **X** to disable sharing via a private URL completely.

5.2. Printing to a PDF file

You can download your entire comic collection or just part of your collection to a PDF file. The Print to PDF screen offers a wide variety of options to customize your PDF file completely.

For example, you can if you want, export only a selection of your comics (for instance, just your wish list), and only export the Title and Genre fields for each comic and in your preferred set sort order too. Want to include an image? That's possible too!

Print a list of all your comics to a PDF file

Click the menu icon top left and click **"Print to PDF"** to enter the PDF screen. You can now set up your document at the top with all the optional settings. Give your list a name too!

Now use the **"Add Columns"** button to **select which fields** you wish to print to the PDF. Don't pick too many, you may not be able to fit everything on one page.

Also, use the **"Add sort fields"** button to **select which fields** you wish to sort on. This decides the order in which the comics are listed.

Finally, use **"Generate PDF File"** at the bottom to create your PDF file.

Print a selection of your comics to a PDF file

Maybe you just want to print out a small selection of your comics to PDF. Maybe just your comics with their publisher set to "Marvel". In that case, you need to make a selection of comics first and then go to the Print to PDF screen.

To begin, you need to **select the comics you want to send to the PDF file**. To select comics, click the checkboxes on the left of each comic entry in the list. Checkboxes are also available in Card View and Images View, just hover your mouse over a comic.

The Select Mode is automatically activated as soon as you checkbox the first comic, clearly indicated by the blue Batch Action Bar that replace the regular toolbar.

5.3. Importing a text file

If you have an existing list of comics in text (.txt) or comma separated values (.csv) format, you can import it using the “**Import from Text / CSV File**” feature in Comic Connect.

If you have a different kind of program for your comic collection right now, see if you can export to CSV or a TXT file from it.



It is important that you match your text file to the fields **we have**. You do this **in step 5** where you **select the fields to import**.

Import from Text / CSV file

1. Click the menu icon top left and click “**Import Data**” to enter the import screen.
2. Click “**Import from Text / CSV File**”.
3. Upload your Text / CSV file.
4. Change the data format settings so it looks correct under the preview.
5. Under “Select your Column fields” pick the fields to **match** your fields! Note that you can also skip fields.
6. Click “**Import comics**” to run the import.

Import problems?

If you’re having troubles with this, make sure you re-check **step 5** to make sure all columns you’re importing **match a field** that we provide.

If you can not match a field to one we have, you can decide to add that column of information to the notes of each comic or just skip that column altogether.

5.4. Exporting to a text file

You can export your **entire** comic collection or just **part of** your collection to a TXT file. The export to text screen offers a wide variety of options to customize your exported list completely.

For example, you can if you want, export only a selection of your comics (for instance, just your wish list), and only export the Title and Genre fields for each comic and in your preferred set sort order too.

Print a list of all your comics to a TXT file

Click the menu icon top left and click “**Export to Text File**” to enter the export screen. You can now set up your document at the top with all the optional settings.

Now use the “**Add Columns**” button to **select which fields** you wish to print to the PDF. Don’t pick too many, you may not be able to fit everything on one page.

Also use the “**Add sort fields**” button to **select which fields** you wish to sort on. This decides the order in which the comics are listed.


Finally, use “**Generate file**” at the bottom to create your text file.



Now click **Export** in the blue Batch Action Bar to enter the PDF settings screen.

Set up your document with the columns and sorting options you wish to use and finally use the “**Generate file**” at the bottom to create your text file with just the selection of comics you made.

5.5. Creating a local backup

We always back up your data on our own servers, every day, but if you want you can generate your own backup, download it and save it on your own computer or thumbdrive.

Creating a local backup

1. Click the menu button top left and click “**Backup / Restore**”.
2. Click the blue “**Create Backup File**” button to generate your backup file.
This can take a while depending on how many comics you have.
3. When finished, click the “**Download Backup**” button to download your backup file as a ZIP.

Keep it safe on your computer or a thumbdrive. The ZIP file you now have is exactly what you need should you ever want to **restore a backup**.

Restoring a backup

If you ever need to restore a backup you previously downloaded you can do so via the same screen:

1. Click the menu button top left and click “**Backup / Restore**”.
2. Click “**Upload Backup**” and choose a previously downloaded backup file to upload.
3. Once the upload has finished, click the blue “**Restore Backup File**” button to restore everything.



Restoring a backup will replace your entire comic collection with your backup. This can not be undone.

7. You’re using Comic Collector on multiple computers and sync between them.
8. You are using (or would like to use) Comic Collector on Windows AND macOS.

However, Comic Connect is not going to work for you if you

- need to customize or manually enter your own Creator or Character lists
- need to list content on the Edit screen’s Contents tab (e.g. for TPBs)
- need User Defined Fields (Comic Connect doesn’t have those).

Why do we like to see you switch?

Given the great trade-in deal we are offering you, it is probably clear that we would like to see most users to switch to Connect. Here’s why:

Don't worry, your data will not be deleted, we will keep your data in the CLZ Cloud, you can still see it, browse it, export it, make a local backup, etc...

- **Q: With Comic Connect, can I still make local backups of my data?**

A: Sure you can. You can make local backups with the Backup feature, or export you data to a CSV for XML file.

- **Q: Do you offer the same Trade-In offer for all Collector desktop programs?**

A: Yes, definitely, the same Trade-In offer holds for all your Collector programs. In fact, if you are gonna switch, I recommend switching for all of them in one go!

- **Q: What if I am already subscribed to Comic Connect?**

5.7. Getting started for Comic Collector users

Comic Connect is full featured and fully customizable comic database software, with a user interface that has been designed to be clean, intuitive and super easy-to-use.

However, the user interface **is** different from the Comic Collector desktop software, so if you are switching from Comic Collector to Comic Connect, the web-based user interface may take some getting used to. Also, in Comic Collector you probably customized the look and layout of the program, so you will have to invest a few minutes to do the same customization here.

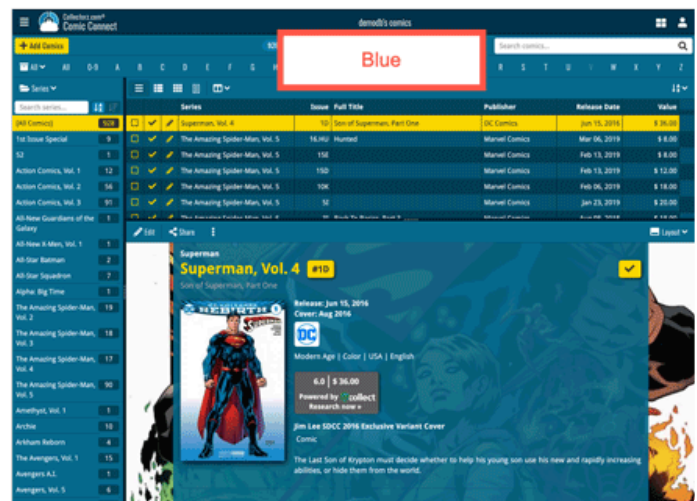
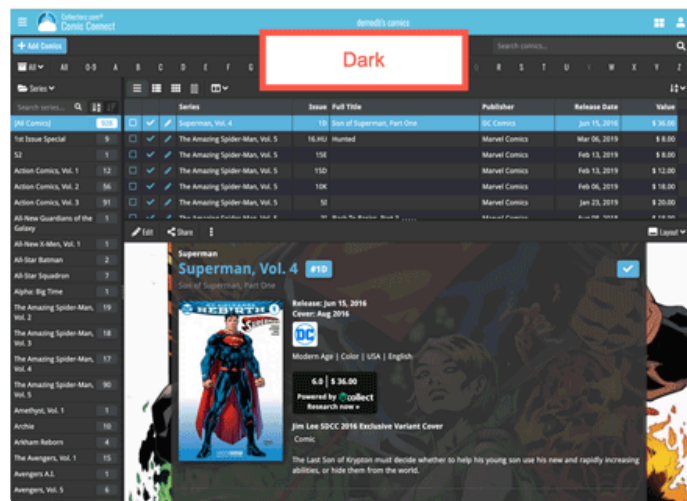
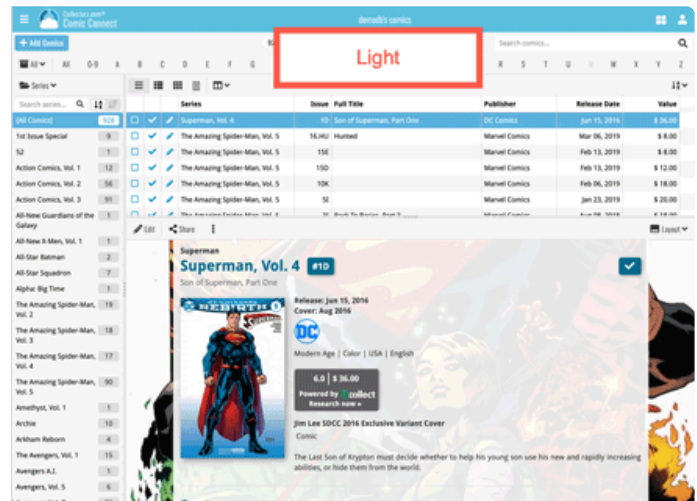
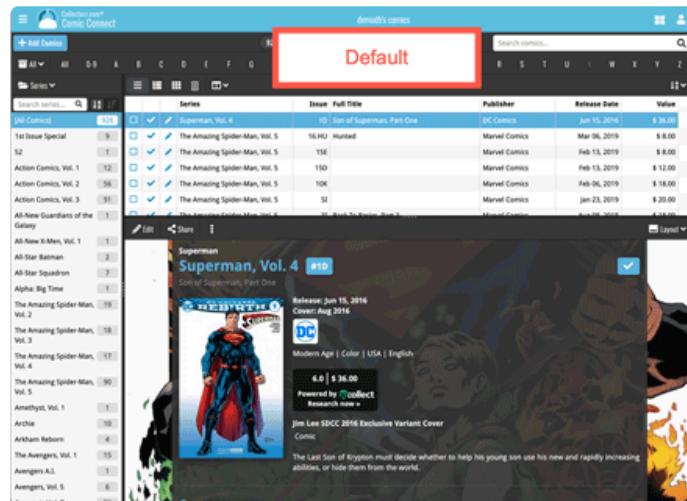
Customizing the Look and Layout

Choosing Columns, Sort Order and Folder options

Comic Connect is fully flexible in the way you show and navigate your comic database.

- use the Columns button to select which fields are shown in the comic list, in List View
- click a column's name in the header row to sort on that column, click again to reverse the sort order
- or use the Sort button on the far right to set up your own Sorting favorites, with single or multi-field sort orders
- use the Folder button on the far left to select which field to use for the folder panel on the left. By default, the panel shows Series folders, but you can of course choose any field, e.g. Genre, Publisher, Release Year, etc... or you can even create multi-level folder favorites!

Adding and Editing Comics

6.3. Re-link Core variant

It could be that the specific variant you own was NOT in Core yet when added to your database, but is listed NOW. In that case, you of course want to change your Core link to the correct variant, so that:


1. When you use Update from Core, you will get the data for the correct variant
2. When you update your values from CovrPrice, you get the value for the correct variant

In the Comic Connect web-based software and the Comic Collector desktop software, there are more options for linking with the Core. Just Unlink from Core, then use Link with Core to re-link.

Re-link comic to Core variant

1. Go to a comic detail panel
2. Tap on the dots In the comic panel
3. Tap the “Relink Core button”
4. Select the variant
5. Click link to variant

Want to know which comics are not linked to your core

1. Click on the menu icon in the top left corner. 
2. Go to “Link comics” (located under import/export).

7.1. Pre-fill Settings

The Pre-fill settings screen in Comic Connect allows you to assign default values to pre-fill fields for comics when adding them to your collection.

For example, If you're adding lots of comics purchased from Amazon, you can define the **Purchase Store** using the Pre-fill settings. Each comic you add will then be assigned that store.

Setting Pre-fill fields

1. Click the menu icon top left and select "**Pre-fill Settings**"
2. Here you can define default values for comics you're going to add next.

7.2. CLZ Cloud viewer

If you want, you can share your collection with friends so they can see which comics you have! All you need is your **public Cloud Share link**.

To find out your public Cloud Share link, click the menu icon top left and select “**CLZ Cloud Sharing**”. Copy the link under “**Public Cloud Sharing**” and send it to your friends!

You will find the **Share** button on comic details pages too so you can share a comic details page directly with a friend.

8.2. My series are not sorted correctly?

If you find that your series list is not sorted correctly, that is most likely to be caused by incorrect series **sort names**.

The easiest way to check and correct series sort names is through the Manage Pick Lists screen.

To open that screen, click the menu icon top right, then choose Manage Pick Lists.

At the top left of the screen, choose "Series list". That will show you your complete Series list, with Display names (at the top, in black) and their Sort Names (at the bottom, in grey).

Now click the pencil icon on the right to edit a series entry.

For instance, if you want "The Amazing Spider-Man, Vol. 2", to sort under A instead of T, make sure the Sort Name is set to "Amazing Spider-Man, Vol. 2", so without "The".

Use the special Sorting options in the Settings screen if you prefer to **show Sort Names** for series everywhere (makes your sorted list a bit easier on the eye), or if you want to **ignore Sort Names** altogether (that is, you prefer your “The ..” series under T).

8.3. Some series are duplicated / split up?

Sometimes you may find that some series folders have duplicated, with the issue list split up between two separate folders for the same series.

This may happen when a series name was changed in our Core. Also because of old problems in the CLZ Cloud syncing system. These problems have all been fixed by now, but you may still see the effect in your database.



Luckily, this duplicate series problem can be resolved easily by **merging** the entries through the Manage Pick Lists screen.


To open that screen, click the menu icon top right, then choose Manage Pick Lists.

At the top left of the screen, choose "Series list". That will show you your complete Series list, with Display names (at the top, in black) and their Sort Names (at the bottom, in grey).

Now:

- Find the duplicate series using the search box top right.
- Checkbox the series entries you want to merge
- Finally, click the Merge icon on the right, for the Series entry you want to merge to, that is, the one you want to keep.
(in most cases, that would be the one that contains the most issues)
