2. Register new account

Registering an account allows you to monitor multiple patients from a single interface, specifically designed for this purpose.

You can register as a clinician or nutritionist. The registration is separated in three main steps, in order to prevent abuse of the system:

- 2. Fill in the details in the registration form
- 3. Fill in billing information (optional step)

How to add a clinician to patient's account?

- 1. Go to the "Clinician" screen from the left menu on the patient's mobile device (or online in Diabetes:M Analytics).
- 2. Enter the code and tap/click the "Add Clinician" button.
- 3. The patient will appear in the Requests section in the menu on the left. There you have to "Accept"

the request from the patient.

4. That's it – you now have access to monitor the patient's data in Diabetes:M Monitor.

5. Subscription

6. Patient List

The patient list panel provides a quick and easy way to access your patient's detailed data.

For every person on the list, you can see the following summarized information:

- 1. Contact information picture, username, real name (if entered by the user), email address
- 2. Quick diabetes status overview this includes the average, min and max glucose readings for the last week and the last month (7 and 30 days). Also included are the number of hypos for the same period, as well as the average number of glucose readings per day.

Search

If you need to find a specific patient in the list, you can do that by typing their name in the search field on the top of the list.

7. Patient Details

The patient details panel on the right of the screen provides all the information entered by the patient. For convenience, the panel is separated into the following sections:



- 1. Main includes summarized general information.
- 2. Diary includes the full logbook entries list of the patient.
- 3. Statistics includes detailed statistical information about the patient.
- 4. Charts contains all the in-depth information about the patient's condition analyzed and summarized in detailed charts and graphs.
- 5. Reports allows the creation and saving of summarized or detailed reports in various formats (pdf, html, csv). Previously saved reports by the patient can be reviewed too.
- 6. Therapy settings allows to view the therapy settings of the patient

7.1. Main

The main section for each patient is an overview statistics screen. It consists of a few different panels representing different views of the patient's data.

Glucose overview

The glucose overview consists of 3 pie charts representing your glucose, insulin intakes and nutrition intake (carbs, protein, fats). The default period shown is 7 days but can be changed from the top right corner of the panel.

Glucose overview – the pie chart representing the glucose overview shows the glucose distribution grouped by glucose levels – hypo, low, normal, high, hyper. Each group is presented with different colors shown under the pie chart with the respective count of entries for each group.

Daily insulin average – this pie chart shows the distribution of insulin for the selected period. The groups shown are bolus, basal and correction. Each group is represented with different colors shown under the pie chart with the respective units of insulin for each group.

Daily meal average – this pie chart shows the distribution of nutrition for the selected period. The groups are carbs, fats, protein. Each group is represented with different colors shown under the pie chart with the respective grams for each group.

Diabetes treatment overview

This panel shows various warnings about the diabetes treatment in the last few weeks.

It notifies the user for missing entries in some categories, glucose variations, repeating events and other important data that the user should know about.

Latest data

The latest data panel shows the latest entered values such as:

- Glucose
- Carbs
- Calories
- Medications
- Bolus insulin
- Basal insulin (or basal rate)
- HbA1c
- Cholesterol
- Blood pressure

Pattern Analysis

The patterns feature analyzes all the patient's entries for the last two weeks and looks for common

trends in your glucose levels. This panel lets you examine the patterns found.

7.2. Logbook

The Logbook is the list of the patient's existing entries. You can quickly review every entry's information in the list, which is arranged by date from the current date on top to previous dates while going down the list.

Logbook list panel

For every Logbook entry you can see:

- Day, time and category
- Photo if there is one in the entry
- · Glucose level if it exists in the entry. Glucose levels are in different colors
 - Purple very low glucose level
 - Blue low glucose level
 - Green normal glucose level
 - Orange high glucose level
 - Red very high glucose level
- With exclamation mark "!" estimated glucose. Means that this entry won't be used for calibrations. Every last entry coming from NFC scan will be marked as estimated.
- Fainted value means that this glucose came from a sensor.
- Under the heading line, all added information in the entry is shown

7.3. Statistics

The summary sections display the most important statistics which are calculated using the user's settings and the data in the entries database.

Personal

- Weight the last recorded weight of the patient
- Body Mass Index (BMI) based on the patient's weight and height this index indicates whether the measures are in normal limits or if they are underweight or overweight.
- **Basal Metabolic Rate (BMR)** BMR represents the number of calories needed to maintain weight if the patient is sedentary. It is based on the patient's weight, height, age, and sex.
- **Daily Calorie Needs** usually the patient needs more calories per day than their BMR index. Daily Calorie Needs is based on BMR and daily activity.
- **Total Insulin** the total daily amount of insulin based on body weight and bolus insulin type (rapid or regular)
- Total Basal Insulin
- **Carbohydrate Ratio** represents how many grams of carbohydrates are covered by 1 unit of insulin. Based on body weight and bolus insulin type (rapid or regular)
- **Insulin Sensitivity** represents how much the blood glucose will be lowered when applying 1 unit of insulin. Based on body weight and bolus insulin type (rapid or regular)

Period average statistics

- Main statistics
- Total records total records count in the database
- Average glucose readings per day displays how many records with blood glucose value are entered in the database
- Estimated HbA1c HbA1c value based on the blood glucose readings for the last 90 days. Requires a minimum of 9 glucose readings to calculate the estimation of HbA1c value.
- **Table with the glucose reading counts** for the current day and the last 7, 14, 30 and 90 days grouped by hypoglycemia, low, normal, high and hyperglycemia blood glucose values.
- **Table with the averages for glucose readings** for the current day and the last 7, 14, 30 and 90 days. Also displays the lowest and highest value for the time period.
- **Table with carbohydrates and insulin daily totals** for the current day and the last 7, 14, 30 and 90 days. Also displays the ratio between bolus and basal insulin daily intake.
- Table with weight for the current day and the last 7, 14, 30 and 90 days and the change between
- Table with the LBGI and HBGI risk indexes and glucose variability indicator. For details see Blood Glucose Indexes.

7.4. Charts


The charts in the Monitor are separated into a few categories. The Monitor web application shows the same charts as the mobile applications with a few differences.

The charts here are with individually controlled time ranges, meaning that every chart on the page can show a different time period. Also, every chart can be expanded on a full screen.

The categories in which the charts are split are:

- Summary includes the pie charts showing the glucose distribution by targets for the last 7/14/30/ 90 days and for each category during the day
- Glucose shows the charts mostly related to glucose levels Glucose hourly overlay, Glucose history, Glucose week overview, Glucose overlay
- Insulin shows insulin-related charts Insulin daily totals and Carbs/insulin averages by meal
- Meal shows meal related charts Meal daily totals, Carbs/insulin averages by meal
- · Injection/test sites shows the injection/test sites images
- Advanced includes the charts for Insulin sensitivity/Carbohydrates ratio chart and the Metabolic control chart
- Other shows the charts related to other parts of the diabetic treatment like HbA1c history, Cholesterol history, Weight history, Blood pressure/Pulse history

Each of the charts targets a different view of the diabetes treatment.




Distribution by days and chart interval selection

These pie charts show blood glucose distribution according to the target limits entered in the settings. You can select the time interval for the other charts as tapping on the corresponding pie chart. Its border will be highlighted.

They are useful because you can see easily what glucose levels averages were in the last 7/14/30/90 days and check how the patient was doing in the near past.

Distribution by category for the selected interval



These pie charts show blood glucose distribution per time category as night, before a meal, after a meal or other if the reading appears in other time.

In those charts, you can find if there are problems in some time of the day, for example, if glucose before bed was usually higher than it needs to be or the patient not measuring glucose enough in some time of the day.

Such strange things about glucose measurements can be seen easily on those charts.

Time categories are:

- "Night" between 21:00 to 07:00 in the morning
- "Before" meal 1 hour before the meal
- "After" meal 2 hours after the meal
- "Other" all other hours and categories as "Snack" and "Fasting Glucose"

Meal hours as breakfast, lunch, and dinner are specified in the Settings screen.


Ambulatory Glucose Profile (AGP)

Ambulatory Glucose Profile (AGP) is a chart for interpreting a patient's daily glucose and insulin patterns. AGP chart provides graphic characterizations of daily glucose patterns. It shows the 10%-90% and 25%-75% percentiles zones and 50% median line of all the glucose readings for the selected interval during 24 hours. This helps to see for which hours you glucose varies the most. 


Glucose Overlay for the selected interval




This chart shows the distribution of all the glucose readings for the selected interval for 24 hours. This helps to see for which hours there isn't enough information. Usually, all the readings are clustered around the meal hours but it is good to know what are the values for blood glucose during the whole day. You can also find some patterns in some hours of low/high glucose levels throughout the day.

Glucose Week Overlay for the selected interval



This chart shows the distribution of all the glucose readings for the selected interval during the week. It can help you find strange glucose level readings by day, for example, you may find out some day of the week the patient has lower/higher glucose levels and you can than think about why this happens and find some actions or events in that day that affect glucose levels.


For every day the averages are calculated for the first and the second half of the day. For every day there are two averages from 12:00 am to 12:00 pm and from 12:00 pm to 12:00 am.



Glucose History for the selected interval


This chart shows the history of all the glucose readings for the selected interval. Averages are calculated per day. You can find out how some events affected the diabetes management, for example, if the patient was on a vacation for a few days, you can see those days averages here.

Averages by meal for the selected interval



This chart shows the minimum, maximum and average values of blood glucose per meal categories. The chart can help you find if the patient has too big deviations of blood glucose during the day. Usually, they may have good average glucose values, but if they have big deviations it's not a good sign for the effectiveness of the diabetes management.

Insulin daily totals for the selected interval



This chart shows the insulin daily totals for the selected interval. Bars show the ratio between basal (orange), bolus (light blue) and correction bolus (dark blue) insulin totals.

It can help you find out if insulin injections are similar through the day or if you have too many corrections, which may be a bad sign.


Description

Orange – used basal (slow acting insulin) for the period.

Light blue – used bolus (fast insulin) for the period.

Dark blue – calculated additional bolus, for example, if the blood glucose was above normal and the app calculated that the patient needs more than usual bolus insulin.


Carbohydrates and insulin averages by meal for the selected interval



This chart shows the average insulin and carbohydrates by periods of the day – night, breakfast, lunch, dinner, before bed.


It can help you to see average carbohydrates intake and average insulin intakes by the time of the day. This way you can find how different carbohydrates amounts affect insulin intakes and the opposite.

Food nutrition data and grams intake for the selected interval (Meal daily totals)



This chart shows carbohydrates (green), proteins (orange) and fats (purple) of the food you take over the selected period of time, distributed by times of the day. Also, it shows calories count (the black line with dots), needed calories and food's weight.


Metabolic control for the selected period



This chart shows the glucose variability and average daily glucose. It tells you if the glucose is varying too much and if daily glucose levels are normal. In the best scenario, most of the dots (readings) should be in the inner circle.

If most of the readings are in the inner circle it means that glucose was stable and didn't vary too much.

Insulin Sensitivity/Carbohydrate Ratio (Figure 12)



Important: These values could be incorrect if there are not enough suitable data patterns found. Using these values for correcting insulin doses must be done with extreme caution and regular blood sugar tests. Always change ISF and I:C values with the help of a clinician.

This chart shows the calculated carbohydrate ratio and insulin sensitivity based on the information during the selected interval. Diabetes:M tries to identify patterns in the data entered with which it can calculate some insulin sensitivity and carbohydrates ratio. If the patient has entered enough and correct data, those values should almost match the insulin sensitivity and carbohydrates ratio.

Description

- 1. Insulin sensitivity bar (blue)
- 2. Carbohydrate ratio bar (orange)
- 3. Average value calculated for the hour (over the bars)
- 4. Count of the successful calculations for the hour. The hour average is calculated using these values (in the brackets)


In the chart description at the bottom of the chart, you can see the total averages for these values based on all successful calculations.

Calculation basics

To calculate carbohydrate ratio successfully there must be a glucose reading, insulin dose, and carbohydrate entry and there must be at least one glucose reading during the second, third or fourth hour after the first reading.

To calculate insulin sensitivity successfully there must be a glucose reading below or above the target and insulin dose entry but NOT a carbohydrate entry. There must be at least one glucose reading during the third, fourth or fifth hour after the first reading.

These values could be wrong if there are not appropriate data patterns found and not enough successful calculations are made for some hours. Using these values for correcting insulin doses must be done with extreme caution and increased blood glucose measuring.



Weight history


This chart shows the history of all the weight recordings for the selected interval.

Blood Pressure & Pulse history



This chart shows the history of all the blood pressure and pulse recordings for the selected interval.

The target zones are calculated depending by the age. When pulse pressure is above or below the safe range the bar is in red.



HbA1c history for the last 2 years

This chart shows the history of all the HbA1c recordings for the last 2 years.


Cholesterol history for the last 2 years



This chart shows the history of all cholesterol recordings for the last 2 years.

Injection and test sites

Those graphics show the insulin injection sites and glucose test sites on the hands. The most frequently used spots (and most recent spots) are with a darker color. Spots color decays in time and disappears in some time if not used again.



7.5. Reports

Using the Reports screen the clinician can review various reports that were generated by the user. The clinician can also generate a report for a defined period of time. The reports that are generated by the clinician are not viewable by the patients.

Report types

LogBook

The LogBook report contains a table including all logged entries for the given period of time. The table includes entry number, date/time, glucose level (colored for low/high/normal), carbohydrates taken, insulin doses (including basal and extended boluses), other medications, category (after/before dinner/ breakfast etc.), notes, additional info. The report is good to show your treatment and intakes in details.

LogBook (Compact)

A report which includes glucose, carbohydrates, bolus and basal in a table separated by every hour of every day in the reporting period.

Category/Distribution

A report which includes glucose, bolus, and carbohydrates, grouped by category (breakfast, after breakfast, lunch, after lunch, etc.) for every day from the reporting period

Report

A detailed report which includes graphs and charts from those seen in the application (Graphs and Charts). Most of the charts can be configured to show different periods of time, including copies of the charts with more than one time period. In this report you can include almost all charts:

- "Distribution by category" charts places the distribution by category pie charts in the attached main report for the last 7, 14, 30, 90 days or for a custom time period.
- "Glucose overlay" chart places the glucose overlay charts in the attached main report for the last 7, 14, 30, 90 days or for a custom time period.
- "Metabolic control" chart places the metabolic control chart in the attached report for the last 7, 14, 30, 90 days or for a custom time period.
- "Category averages" chart places the mealtime averages charts in the attached main report for the last 7, 14, 30, 90 days or for a custom time period.
- "Insulin daily totals" chart places the totals for insulin intake chart in the attached main report for the last 7, 14, 30, 90 days or for a custom time period.
- "Carbs/Insulin averages" chart places the averages for insulin and carbohydrates intake charts in the attached main report for the last 7, 14, 30, 90 days or for a custom time period.
- "Carbs/Calories totals" chart places the totals for carbohydrates and calories intake charts in the attached main report for the last 7, 14, 30, 90 days or for a custom time period.
- "Glucose history" chart places the glucose history charts in the attached main report for the last 7, 14, 30, 90 days or for a custom time period.
- "Weight history" chart places the weight history chart in the attached main report for the last 7,

14, 30, 90 days or for a custom time period.

- "Blood Pressure and Pulse history" chart places the blood pressure and pulse history chart in the attached main report for the last 7, 14, 30, 90 days or for a custom time period.
- "HbA1c history" chart places the blood pressure and pulse history chart in the attached main report for the last 2 years.
- "Cholesterol history" chart places the cholesterol history chart in the attached main report for the last 2 years.
- "Injection sites information" graphic places the injection sites information graphic in the attached main report for the last 2 years.

Patterns report

Report including all the data from our patterns feature including all the patterns found within the last 14 days and the entries matched in the patterns

The reports can be generated in different formats – XLS, PDF, HTML and can be printed, shared in some apps (google drive, email clients and others similar) or sent via email.

8. Monitor Settings

The Settings screen lets you set your desired settings to which the patient's data will be adapted. The patient's settings may be different than your settings.

Brief settings description

Units and Formatting – you can select the US or metric system, blood glucose unit like mmol/L or mg/ dL, HbA1c unit, carbohydrates unit, date formats. All the patient's data will be shown in your desired units, regardless of his units and formatting settings.

Glucose Levels Target Range – Glucose Hi, Glucose Low and Glucose target values. All charts, graphs and statistics will be colored different according to the settings here. The patient's data will be colored according to your glucose target levels settings here, regardless of his own settings.

Data Save Reset The settings below affect how you can view the data in Diabetes:M Monitor and they do not affect Diabetes:M mobile app or Diabetes Analytics settings.


